SOME GREAT FUNDRAISING IDEAS

1. Cook food or bake some sweets to sell to family or friends or at a market.
2. Raffles. Put together a couple of men's and women's "health and wellness" baskets or anything else to raffle.
3. Hold a fundraiser event at a local bowling alley, laser tag, game arcade, etc.
4. Golf day (arrange a golf day with gifts to auction)
5. Film day/night (ask to get the venue sponsored. Sell tickets)
6. Scavenger hunt (hide anything and make it a competition with levels)
7. Fun walk/run (enter for a good cause)
8. Cook off / bake off
9. Auction (art/items/anything with a special signature/other)
10. Host a talent show (paint/build/photography/etc)
11. 'Boeresport' day (make it a competition)
12. Prize raffle. Get a big prize sponsored and raffle tickets for the prize
13. Selling branded items (tshirts, water bottles, cat/dog beds, keyrings, other)
14. Organise an animal theme gala dress up event (Invite supporters to an elegant evening of dinner, drinks, live entertainment, and ample fundraising opportunities)
15. Wine tasting (get wine bottles/experts to sponsor. Get friends/family to pay for tickets. Auction best bottle with most votes)
16. Auction holiday/vacation
17. Start a TikTok challenge
18. Arrange a dunk tank / carnival day
19. Ask friends and family to donate dog/cat food
20. VIP Fundraising dinner



Whatever you choose to do, no matter how big or small, have fun with it! I've learned that people are only as excited as what you are — passion is contagious, so lead with positive energy, and people will want to know what you're a part of, who you're connected to and join along!

AREAS WHERE FUNDS ARE NEEDED/ALLOCATED

(You can specify an area of your choice for your fundraising efforts or you can specify that you leave it at our discretion)

1. Call out fees for inspectors (this is to help cover basic fuel costs)
2. Dog and Cat beds (fabric and labour to make beds to sell and/or to give to inspectors to donate where animals do not have any)
3. Cat and dog food (this is currently a very big expense on call outs)
4. Deworming/Tick treatments (inspectors assist with this on 90% of call outs)
5. Vet bills (When our inspectors seize animals or get them surrendered, they generally need veterinary treatment which the previous owners do not pay)
6. Vet reports (our inspectors generally require vet reports to assist with prosecution. Vet reports vary between R500 – R1500)
7. Vaccinations (our inspectors are required to assist with this)
8. Sterilisations (sterilisations is one of the most important and most expensive exercises for inspectors. Owners do not or cannot pay this).
9. Branded (I'm a responsible pet owner) t-shirts for people who agree to sterilise their dogs if we assist due to the fact that they can't afford it.
10. School visits for educational purposes (transport is required along with small gifts and the rental of mascot to help make the day memorable).
11. Inspector equipment (inspector equipment like traps, nets, poles, gloves etc is extremely expensive but important to help inspectors to catch animals safely)
12. Assisting inspectors with maintenance requirements on enclosures/kennels/catteries.
13. Inspector outreach assistance with animal housing, bedding, veterinary care, health care, food, other and follow ups.
14. To assist us in the process of educating the public, we are launching a corporate skills development program where we will provide free training on our environmental issues in our country (this includes environment/animals and everyone associated with either). Our aim is to provide free talks but explain that donations are welcome. This way we get a captive audience in a controlled environment that we can educate on matters they were not aware off. (we will require petrol and information packs/something memorable to share with the family).
